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Tschichold's New Typography. Jan Tschichold (1903-1972) By the later 1920's avant garde typography was making inroads into more mainstream commercial design much through the efforts of designer Jan Tschichold. Unlike the avant garde artists of his era, Tschichold was a traditionally trained calligrapher and typographer and had formally studied book design at the Leipzig Academy.

Tschichold's New Typography - Design History

This book also charts the development of the New Typography, a broad-based movement across Central Europe that included “The Ring,” a group formed by Schwitters in 1927. Tschichold played a crucial role in defining this movement, documenting the theory and practice in his most influential book, The New Typography (1928), still regarded as a seminal text of graphic design.
